The VB was formed in June, 1969, by a coalition of "New Left" organizations to encourage American youth to travel to Cuba in defiance of a ban on travel to that country by the United States Department of State. The ostensible purpose of the travel was to assist the CASTRO Regime in the harvesting of sugar cane and other agricultural products and to give young Americans the experience of living in a revolutionary communist country.

On February 16, 1971, a confidential source advised that [REDACTED]

b7C [REDACTED] had been referred to as part of a group of female names, some of which are allegedly leaders and/or group leaders of the Third World Women's Alliance (TWWA).

The TWWA is headquartered at Saint Peter's Episcopal Church, 346 West 20th Street, New York City, and has approximately 200 members. The organization has been described as fighting against the sex exploitation of women. The TWWA is scheduled to participate in women's conferences to be held in Toronto, Montreal, and Vancouver, Canada, during 1971, which will include women from North Vietnam, North Korea, South Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos.

On March 29, 1971, records of the Bureau of Criminal Identification, New York City Police Department (NYCPD), and the records of the Security and Intelligence Section, NYCPD, were negative with regard to the subject.

This passport is valid for five years travel to all countries except Cuba, mainland China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

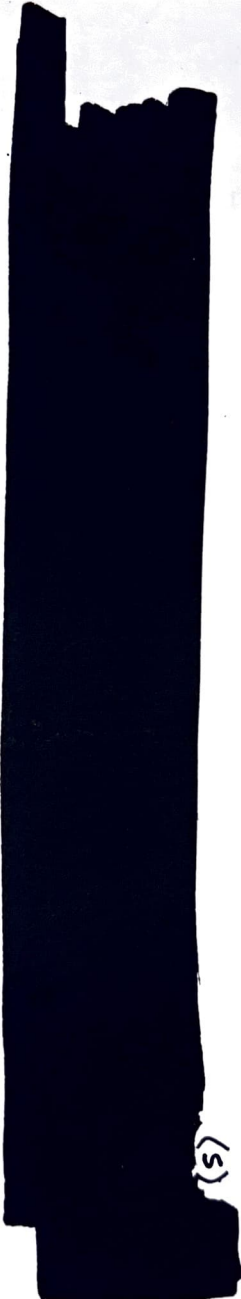
By operation of law effective March 15, 1971, the restriction against travel to mainland China was lifted.

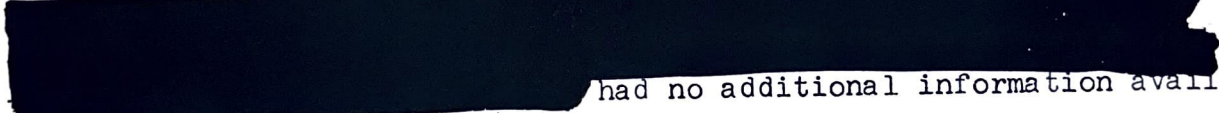
