STOP THE FRAME-UP OF EVE ROSAHN!

Eve Rosahn, a plaintiff in Clark v. USA and a long-time activist in the anti-imperialist movement, is being framed by the U.S. government. She is currently being held on \$250,000 bail for a fabricated indictment from Rockland County, and on contempt for refusing to cooperate with a federal grand jury witchhunt. Eve was arrested on October 27th by the joint FBI/NYPD "anti-terrorism" task force. Although the FBI clearly knew Eve's whereabouts and activities, they conducted SWAT-team raids on apartments of her family and friends before they arrested her. Then, in a highly publicized media event, they arrested Eve, whisked her off to Rockland County and held her on a completely unheard of quarter-million dollar bail on the vaguest of allegations. Since then she has been indicted by a Rockland County grand jury, held in contempt by a special federal grand jury and moved to the Metropolitan Correctional Center in New York where she is kept in isolation, allowed to see only her lawyers and immediate family. EVE IS INNOCENT OF ALL THE CHARGES BROUGHT AGAINST HER, AND THE GOVERNMENT KNOWS IT. She is being framed on the basis of innuendo and unsubstantiated charges. She is a victim of police and media created hysteria and clearly the target of the government/FBI counter-insurgency war program, COINTELPRO.

The Committee for the Suit Against Government Misconduct (CSAGM) fully supports her and demands her immediate release. We also extend our full support to the four combatants captured in Nyack, N.Y., including Judith Clark, also a member of the CSAGM, Kathy Coudin, Samuel Brown and David Gilbert. We extend our solidarity to Brother Sekou Odinga; and to Sister Fulani Sunni-Ali, vindicated of her false arrest, but still facing a grand jury subpoena. We extend our full support and solidarity to the Puerto Rican and Chicano/Mexicano activists who are also facing a federal grand jury.

For almost 15 years, Eve has been an

anti-imperialist activist -- from her opposition to the war in Vietnam, to support for the Black liberation struggle, to the struggle for women's liberation. And, for the past 3½ years, as a member of the CSAGM and as a plaintiff in Clark v. USA, she has been an active fighter against the FBI-led counter-insurgency program, COINTELPRO. She is an anti-imperialist fighter who is one of the Anti-Springbok 5, 5 white people who were arrested during a militant demonstration against the South African rugby tour. THIS IS WHY EVE ROSAHN IS CURRENTLY INCARCERATED, AND FOR NO OTHER REASON. She is a target of the government's rapidly escalating war against the Black liberation struggle and other national liberation struggles and anti-imperialist movement within the borders of the U.S.

DOMESTIC COUNTER-INSURGENCY WARFARE

COINTELPRO is a program of domestic counter-insurgency warfare. Its explicit purpose is to "expose, disrupt, misdirect or otherwise neutralize" the Black liberation struggle. It is also used against the Puerto Rican, Native American and Chicano/Mexicano liberation struggles.

Editorial:

B.L.A. & REVOLUTIONARY ARMED TASK FORCE ADVANCE THE STRUGGLE

The Committee for the Suit Against Government Misconduct fully supports the Black Liberation Army and the Revolutionary Armed Task Force. We support the right of oppressed nations to wage armed struggle and build people's war to free their nations, and we support the participation of white anti-imperialists in the struggle against imperialism and white supremacy at the highest level.

The Black Liberation Army is the expression of the aspirations of the Black nation for self-determination, land and independence -- the goals of the Black nation in struggle for 400 years. There has never been a national liberation struggle that has achieved self-determination without waging armed struggle. This has been borne out in our own lifetime by the righteous struggles of the peoples of Vietnam, Mozambique, Guinea-Bissau, Angola, Zimbabwe -- and is currently being put into practice in Namibia, Azania, Palestine, Puerto Rico and New Afrika. To support the right of self-determination is to support the waging of armed struggle against imperialism, colonialism and white supremacy, for liberation.

Nothing exposes more clearly the necessity for oppressed peoples to wage national liberation war against imperialism than the nature of COINTELPRO -- u.s. imperialism's counterinsurgency war program. Through our struggle against COINTELPRO, time and time again we have come up against the fact that u.s. imperialism is in its very essence a system waging genocidal war against the nations it oppresses. COINTELPRO plays a central role in this war assassinating, imprisoning and trying to disrupt and destroy the Black, Puerto Rican, Native American and Chicano/Mexicano struggles, and attacking white anti-imperialists ("destroy this insidious movement") who ally with, support and follow the leadership of the national liberation movements.

The events of the past year have shown beyond a doubt that COINTELPRO has been unsuccessful, has been unable to destroy the national liberation movements and their revolutionary leadership. Despite the state's

kidnapping and coopting of Alfredo Mendez, and despite repeated covert and brutal attacks against the Puerto Rican POWs, the 11 POWs maintain their steadfast commitment to Puerto Rican independence, to non cooperation with the state, and continue to play a key role in the building of support for all levels of struggle to win independence and socialism for Puerto Rico. In June, the Red Unit of the Black Liberation Army retaliated for the capture of James York by the N.Y.P.D., by carrying out an action against a New York City cop in Manhattan and issuing a communique opening up was against killer cops. Only July 18, in Harlem, the Committee to Honor New Afrikan Freedom Fighters led a march and rally to honor Sister Assata Shakur and the Black Liberation Army. On September 26, in the context of a worldwide struggle against the racist South African rugby tour, the Black Liberation Army carried out an act of proletarian internationalism, bombing the headquarters of the Eastern Rugby Union, the organization that sponsored the tour in the u.s.

On October 20, under the leadership of the Black Liberation Army, the Revolutionary Armed Task Force attempted the expropriation of 1.6 million dollars from a Brinks truck in Nyack, N.Y. Four freedom fighters were captured: Samuel Brown, David Gilbert, Kathy Boudin and Judith Clark. Judith Clark is a plaintiff in Clark v. U.S.A. and a member of the Committee for the Suit Against Government Misconduct. We support and honor these freedom fighters. We love and respect our sister, Judy Clark, and all white anti-imperialists to whom freedom and an end to oppression and white supremacy are more important than the fear of imprisonment or death. White anti-imperialists like Judith Clark who follow revolutionary Black leadership and fight like John Brown not only provide the clearest example among white people of solidarity with the struggle for

FORUM BUILDS UNITY AGAINST REPRESSION

On November 15th in New York City, over 300 people attended a forum -- A Program of Unity Against Repression: A Call To Resist. The forum, initiated by the New Movement in Solidarity with Puerto Rican Independence and Socialism, struggled for all progressive forces to unite to fight repression based upon support for national liberation and opposition to imperialism. In particular, leaders from the Puerto Rican, Chicano/Mexicano and Black liberation struggles argued for the strategy of protracted peoples war as the only strategy to defeat imperialism and achieve independence and socialism, and, therefore, the only strategy capable of defeating repression. The clear message of the program was that a powerful unity is being built among the national liberation movements based in the common strategy of peoples war against imperialism.

The speakers emphasized that this was a period of advancement for the national liberation movements and increasing contradictions and weakness for imperialism. Events in Puerto Rico -- including the struggle at the University and the strikes by public employees -- show the growing unity of the armed clandestine movement and the mass struggle. The recent actions of the Black Liberation Army targetting the apartheid South African Rugby Tour and killer cops demonstrate the reconsolidation of the Black liberation struggle and the greatest threat to U.S. imperialism. All the speakers emphasized that only with a correct analysis of the current period could we develop a correct strategy to fight repression.

Therefore, the current wave of attacks on the Puerto Rican independence movement -- in particular the renewed use of the grand jury and the continuing harassment of the 11 Puerto Rican prisoners of war -- are attempts by U.S. imperialism to attack the leadership of the growing independence movement. This repression is being fought by an uncompromising stance of non-collaboration with the U.S. government and organizing even greater support for the armed struggle. Similarly, the heightening of COINTELPRO attacks on the Black liberation struggle in this period -- the murder of freedom fighter

Mtayari Shabaka Sundiata, the torture of Sekou Odinga, the arrest of Sister Fulani Sunni-Ali and other attacks on the Republic of New Afrika -- are attempts by the U.S. government to stop the consolidation of leading forces in the Black liberation struggle and to brand freedom fighters as terrorists. Attacks on white anti-imperialists, particularly May 19th Communist Organization and Eve Rosahn, are part of this program, designed to destroy those forces who support the Black liberation struggle, other national liberation struggles, and especially the right of oppressed nations to wage armed struggle for liberation. Again, the strategy that was put forward to fight this was uncompromising opposition to U.S. imperialism and organizing support for the waging of a protracted peoples war to free New Afrika. The participation of Sister Fulani in the program was evidence of the success of this strategy. All the speakers made it clear that the U.S. is moving more and more towards blatant fascism, but that repression only breeds heightened resistance.

The forum expressed strong support for the participation of white anti-imperialist and revolutionary forces in the struggle against imperialism. Messages from the four combatants arrested in Nyack, N.Y. (three of whom are white) and Eve Rosahn, and the speech by May 19th Communist Organization made it clear that white people were not only there as supporters of Third World struggles, but as active participants in the struggle to defeat imperialism. The spirit of John Brown was evoked as an example of the role that white people can choose to play.

In sum, the forum was not only a strong, visible response to the current wave of repression, but part of building the unity and strategic alliance among oppressed nations and between the national liberation struggles and white anti-imperialists who are willing to fight alongside of and under the leadership of those struggles. The program made it clear that it was this side that will win.

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Senate Committee: Arm of COINTELPRO

The Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Security and Terrorism held hearings throughout the spring to mobilize public support for the U.S. government's "war on terrorism." It continued the parade of friendly witnesses whose testimony is intended to establish the existence of an "international KGB-directed terrorist network." It has used pure fiction, innuendo and rhetoric to build the ideological back-up for the government's current escalation of its counter-insurgency war against the Black liberation struggle, the Puerto Rican independence movement and all anti-imperialist struggles within the U.S.

Though the Subcommittee has withheld its schedule of hearings, its chairman, Sen. Jeremiah Denton said in an interview that the IRA will be the committee's next target. An investigation into the IRA will enable the Subcommittee to move into the second phase of its work: to establish the "links" between international "terrorism" and organizations and movements within the U.S. For U.S. imperialism the IRA makes an excellent starting point because the Northern Aid Committee, which gives political and material support to the struggle in Northern Ireland, has already been forced to register as an agent of a foreign group; and because for years, grand jury subpoenas and FBI investigations have been used to build the case that U.S. citizens are running guns to the IRA illegally.

This move by the Subcommittee is clearly defined in a quote from Samuel T. Francis, one of Sen. East's top aides and an "expert" on "international terrorism." He said:

"The most useful thing you can do with a terrorist group is to infiltrate them and develop informants in them and develop adequate surveillance and intelligence techniques on their support groups, which is very controversial because they're not violent and they're not illegal. It can't be done unless you can show that they're actually involved in illegal activities, and you can't show that because you can't investigate them. To me it's a moot question, and it's very academic to sit around and talk about what we're going to do about terrorism until

we can develop intelligence and find out what the terrorists are doing, what their friends are doing."

One road the Subcommittee will take was exposed in the trial of Puerto Rican revolutionary Oscar Lopez in Chicago. The U.S. government kidnapped, tortured and was able to coopt Alfredo Mendez, one of the original defendants in the case of the 11 Puerto Rican POWs. Mendez not only agreed to testify for the government, but went even further to put out COINTELPRO lies in open court. His testimony attacked the Movimiento de Liberación Nacional (MLN), a revolutionary Puerto Rican independence organization and their organizing in the Puerto Rican community in Chicago. The government is attempting to smash the leading, public organization in the Puerto Rican community by targetting it as a "support apparatus" for the FALN because seven years of FBI harassment and illegal grand juries have failed to destroy the MLN and its support among the Puerto Rican people in the U.S. The MLN fully expects the traitor Alfredo Mendez to appear as an "expert witness" on the Puerto Rican independence movement and the FALN, and that his "naming names" will result in subpoenas being issued to other activists.

Another indication of the direction the Subcommittee will take is the testimony of Robert Moss, co-author with Arnold de Borchgrave of the pro-CIA novel, The Spike. He simultaneously attacked both the PLO and the Native American movement while making a case for military occupation of oil fields and coal mining areas at a time when the Native American movement is waging a major battle for control over its land and resources from the Black Hills of South Dakota to the Black Mesa in Arizona. The Subcommittee is establishing the basis for the massive military occupation of Native American lands under the guise of protecting energy sources from "terrorist attack."

The Subcommittee is a key part of the government's overall COINTELPRO strategy for this period, a strategy which has already meant the frame-up of James York and the man-hunt for Anthony LaBorde; the current wave of attacks on the RNA; the continuing attacks and imprisonment of the 11 Puerto Rican POWs and the renewed grand jury attacks on the MLN; and increasing attacks on white anti-imperialists engaged in the fight against white supremacy and in support of the Black liberation struggle. In addition to being COINTELPRO's publicity arm, the Subcommittee has responsibility for all legislation concerning "national security" -- the FBI, the FOIA, and all intelligence-related issues. The Subcommittee has held both public and secret sessions on the repeal of the FOIA, on the Naming Names Bill and on increased powers for the FBI and CIA -- shaping and directing America's counter-insurgency war machine.

The anti-repression movement, though it has targetted the committee as a major threat, has done so on an incorrect and dangerous basis. Committee members are portrayed as clowns and lunatics, and witness' testimony as laughable. This is the furthest thing from the truth. Jeremiah Denton comes to the Senate from Cullman, Alabama, which is the site of Klan military training camps, and he was endorsed by the Klan during his campaign. We will soon see the issuing of subpoenas by the committee to Third World and white anti-imperialist forces, subpoenas which hold the threat of contempt for refusal to testify. The committee has already indicated its "interest" in the events in Nyack and desire to investigate those organizations which have

been targetted by the Justice Dept. and media. The Subcommittee is no laughing matter.

The white dominated anti-repression movement sees the Subcommittee as a threat because they believe it will launch broad investigations of legal political organizations. Although the Subcommittee has threatened to investigate groups like NACLA and the Campaign for Political Rights, they will not be its primary focus. The main target of the committee is the revolutionary Black and Puerto Rican forces within the U.S. and their supporters.

We can never effectively fight the Subcommittee if we don't see it as an important arm of COINTELPRO. U.S. counter-insurgency strategy now is based in the reality of imperialism losing ground all over the world and it is desperately tightening its grip on what it still holds. As the Black liberation struggle, the Puerto Rican independence movement and other national liberation struggles heighten, the U.S. will heighten its efforts to destroy those movements and to misdirect and smash progressive and anti-imperialist movements of white people. To defeat the Subcommittee we must fight against the entire counter-insurgency strategy.

AN OPEN LETTER TO FRIENDS AND SUPPORTERS OF CLARK V. USA

Dear Friend,

This issue of TIP OF THE ICEBERG comes out in a period in history when the combined forces of national liberation are on the rise. Over the years, we have written about and argued for solidarity and support for the New Afrikan, Puerto Rican, and other national liberation struggles, as well as for the struggle to free all political prisoners and Prisoners of War.

As is the nature of imperialism, the u.s. has responded to the heightening and victories of national liberation by rearming its military and counterinsurgency potential and coming down with escalated repression against national liberation movements and anti-imperialists around the world and here in the u.s. The government is now using the attempted Brinks expropriation in Nyack, NY on October 20, 1981, as a justification for a massive campaign of repression against revolutionary forces. Through the use of "criminal" prosecutions, grand juries, and outright assassinations, the government is trying to stem the tide of revolutionary and progressive forces.

We understand that it is critical for the Committee for the Suit Against Government Misconduct to continue to fight for the politics we have argued for over three years. We fully support the two members of our organization who are presently in jail, along with all those who have been attacked by the state.

It is also critical for all those who have supported the Committee and our work against the FBI's counterintelligence/counterinsurgency programs to understand the current government counter-offensive and to unite with the strategy to defeat it. In addition to political support, material aid is urgently needed to carry on the work.

In order to defend those people presently in jail as well as those who may face prison for their righteous refusal to collaborate with grand juries, funds are needed for legal fees and expenses. For the Committee for the Suit Against Government Misconduct, we must be able to continue to publish TIP OF THE ICEBERG as well as to continue our fight in the courts, as part of the movement to defeat COINTELPRO and all counterinsurgency programs.

FREE THE ANTI-SPRINGBOK FIVE !

The Anti-Springbok 5 are anti-imperialist activists who were arrested on September 26 at a demonstration at Kennedy Airport protesting the presence in this country of the South African rugby team. This demonstration was one of many which took place worldwide as thousands of people expressed their outrage at the use of the Springboks as "ambassadors of good will" for the fascist apartheid regime in South Africa.

The u.s. government, which is strengthening its ties with South Africa, granted visas to the team in direct contravention of U.N. resolutions calling on all governments and people to isolate South Africa in general and to avoid taking part in sports competitions which lend legitimacy to its existence.

The 5 were brutally assaulted and maced after their arrest by Port Authority police. Originally held without bail, they were released until the Queens district attorney brought new charges against them and had their bail raised to \$10,000 each. When the money was raised, the d.a. got an order without notice to defendants forcing a

hearing each time bail was posted to inquire into the source of the money. This was an attempt to get the names of the hundreds of people who had contributed to the bail fund. All the legal proceedings have been marked by secret communications between the d.a., the judges and law enforcement agents.

The 5 are waging an offensive against their charges on the grounds that they were following the U.N. mandate that all progressive peoples and governments and organizations fight apartheid and support the just national liberation struggle of the Azanian people. They have submitted numerous motions to dismiss and to get information regarding the misconduct which has surrounded their case. They are also seeking hearings into these matters. At the present time, the d.a. is preparing his response.

FBI BROADENS ATTACKS

The FBI and Justice Dept. are broadening their attacks on progressive forces, using the excuse of "investigating" the attempted expropriation in Nyack, NY. Previously, they have used the media created atmosphere of hysteria to raid the homes of not only those arrested in Nyack, but also of their families and friends. They have stopped countless numbers of people in Black communities and arrested two completely innocent people on Long Island in their alleged "hunt" for more suspects.

Currently the FBI is using the federal grand jury to further its harassment and attempted intimidation of a broad range of people. Mrs. Bella Rosenberg is one target of this COINTELPRO attack. She has been visited by the FBI and threatened with being subpoenaed to the grand jury if she continues to refuse to talk to them -- their rationale, a claim that Judith Clark had been known to borrow her car.

The CSAGM condemns this harassment of Mrs. Rosenberg and further demands that the FBI come forward with an explanation of how they know anything about the use of Mrs. Rosenberg's car. We also urge anyone who has been visited or harassed by the FBI to immediately contact us at (212) 989-8898.

COINTELPRO has been responsible for the murders of hundreds of Black revolutionaries, the imprisonment of thousands more, and the massive use of terror in Black communities across the U.S. Fred Hampton, Malcolm X, Martin Luther King -- assassinated by COINTELPRO. Geronimo Pratt, Dhoruba Moore, Sundiata Acoli, Sha Sha Malik -- imprisoned by COINTELPRO. Black residents of 50 Morningside Drive -- subjected to a terror raid by COINTELPRO.

COINTELPRO has also attacked the white anti-imperialist movement as part of its domestic counter-insurgency war strategy. In particular, those forces that support the right of oppressed peoples to engage in armed struggle have come under attack. The FBI has operated for the past 15 years under the explicit mandate to "destroy this insidious movement" and to drive a wedge between the revolutionary Black nationalist movement and its white supporters. Plaintiffs -- including Eve Rosahn and Judith Clark -- in Clark v USA, a \$100 million lawsuit against the FBI, Richard Nixon and other government officials, were all named by the government as targets of this program. The suit, which functions under the leadership of the Black liberation struggle, is part of an overall strategy to expose and fight against COINTELPRO.

We know that Eve has been a target of COINTELPRO for many years. Directly from the files that the FBI has been forced to release to her, we find evidence that:

- **she was originally targetted because she was active in Columbia SDS, the December 4th Movement (named after Fred Hampton and Mark Clark, murdered by the FBI and Chicago police on Dec. 4, 1969) and because she displayed "evidence of Black Panther Party sympathy".
- **because of her political activities she was subjected to daily surveillance by the FBI for extended periods of time.
- **the FBI made attempts to exploit and heighten internal political contradictions:
"The apparent change in ROSAHN's activities may indicate something pertinent to the moment (even a change in allegiance) which can be seized on for the Bureau's bene-

fit. Every possible advantage will be taken of that possibility."

--FBI memo, dated April 3, 1970

- **During a period when Eve was ill, the FBI sent a paid informant/agent to pose as a friend and visit her every week, trying to gain her confidence.
- **her file, which the FBI claimed to have closed, was ordered reopened on the very day --February 24, 1976-- that Eve filed under the FOIA for release of her files.

AN ESCALATING WAR

These were all actions that the FBI took from 5 to 10 years ago. In the past 5 years the situation has only heightened. The terror campaign that the FBI unleashed against the Black movement throughout the 60's and

70's failed. The revolutionary movement reemerged stronger than ever, as exemplified by the liberation of freedom fighter Assata Shakur from Clinton prison on November 2, 1979.

In 1971 the U.S. government response to the national liberation struggles and anti-imperialist movement was to use every means at its disposal to try to crush them. In 1981, faced with heightening internal contradictions and growing opposition, it is doing everything it possibly can to crush these movements and save itself. COINTELPRO has been responsible for the murder of Black revolutionary freedom fighter Mtayari Shabaka Sundiata; the arrest and torture of Sekou Odinga; the arrest of Fulani Sunni-Ali; and the arrest and beating of two Black people on Long Island when the woman was "mistaken" for Assata Shakur; the lies and distortions that have called the Provisional Government of the Republic of New Afrika and May 19th Communist Organization part of a "network of terror."

In addition, the joint FBI/NYPD "anti-terrorism" taskforce has smashed down the doors of dozens of homes, including Eve's, her mothers, and her friends'. When the police raided Judy Clark's apartment they illegally seized some of Eve's FOIA files. U.S. Attorney John Martin has personally directed the military/legal attack on Eve, Fulani Sunni-Ali, and the 4 combatants arrested in Nyack. He has prevented people from seeing the attorneys of their choice, particularly Chokwe Lumumba, a Vice President of the Provisional Government of the

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self-determination, but also point the way for white working class people -- especially women -- who must also fight to defeat imperialism in order to be free. We support the Black Liberation Army and the Revolutionary Armed Task Force, a formation of New Afrikan freedom fighters and white anti-imperialists.

We support Eve Rosahn -- also a plaintiff in Clark v. U.S.A. and a member of the Committee for the Suit Against Government Misconduct -- who is being framed by the u.s. government in their reactionary attack on anti-imperialists who support the Black liberation struggle and the right of oppressed nations to wage armed struggle. In her courageous stand of non-cooperation with the grand jury, Eve has exhibited her commitment to anti-imperialist principles and to total struggle against the imperialist state.

Shortly after her capture, Judith Clark wrote:

"I've thought a lot about the period of the early 70's and the heightened struggles and attacks on the Black struggle and revolutionary nationalists. There are clearly many parallels. But also important changes. Revolutionary nationalists are more advanced and

stronger, having fought through and survived, changed and grown through the 70's. And the world is different with national liberation struggles heightening and winning internationally. And also, rooted in the lessons of the Third World and the leadership of national liberation struggles, we have significantly changed. I think it is very, very important to the balance of forces that white revolutionaries and anti-imperialists are struggling to be full allies of the national liberation struggles and the Black liberation struggle in particular. And based in that, fighting to build revolutionary organization and practice that plants us firmly among the revolutionary forces in the War in Amerika....Now more than ever, I understand the importance of July 18th (New Afrikan Freedom Fighter Day)."

Support for the forces who struggle against imperialism and white supremacy on the highest level is fundamental to every aspect of the struggle for freedom -- and to fighting repression. Every attempt by the government to label national liberation struggles and anti-imperialists as "terrorist" must be answered by the cry: "They are not terrorists, they are freedom fighters."

STOP THE ATTACKS ON FULANI SUNNI-ALI!

Fulani Sunni-Ali, Chairperson of the Peoples Center Council of the Republic of New Afrika (RNA), has been the target of an intense COINTELPRO attack. She has been the object of this terror campaign because she is a revolutionary woman and a leader in the struggle for the independence of the Black nation. Immediately following the October 20th arrests in Nyack, 200 FBI agents accompanied by SWAT teams, helicopters and tanks raided a farm house in Mississippi where Fulani, 12 young children and a grandfather were living. Fulani and the children were handcuffed and she was arrested. Fulani was then taken to New York City and, with banner headlines announcing the "capture of a terrorist", charged with conspiracy in connection with the Brinks robbery.

From the moment she was arrested the FBI and Justice Dept. knew that Fulani was completely innocent of all charges since she had in her possession a receipt proving she was in New Orleans at the time she was allegedly in Mt. Vernon, N.Y. In fact, as the RNA publically charged at a press conference held while she was still in jail, the FBI knew before they arrested Fulani that she was innocent since they have had her under surveillance for many months. The immediate response by the RNA and the widespread support from the Black community and progressive movements, forced the Justice Dept. to release Fulani. However, as she was leaving the Metropolitan Correc-
