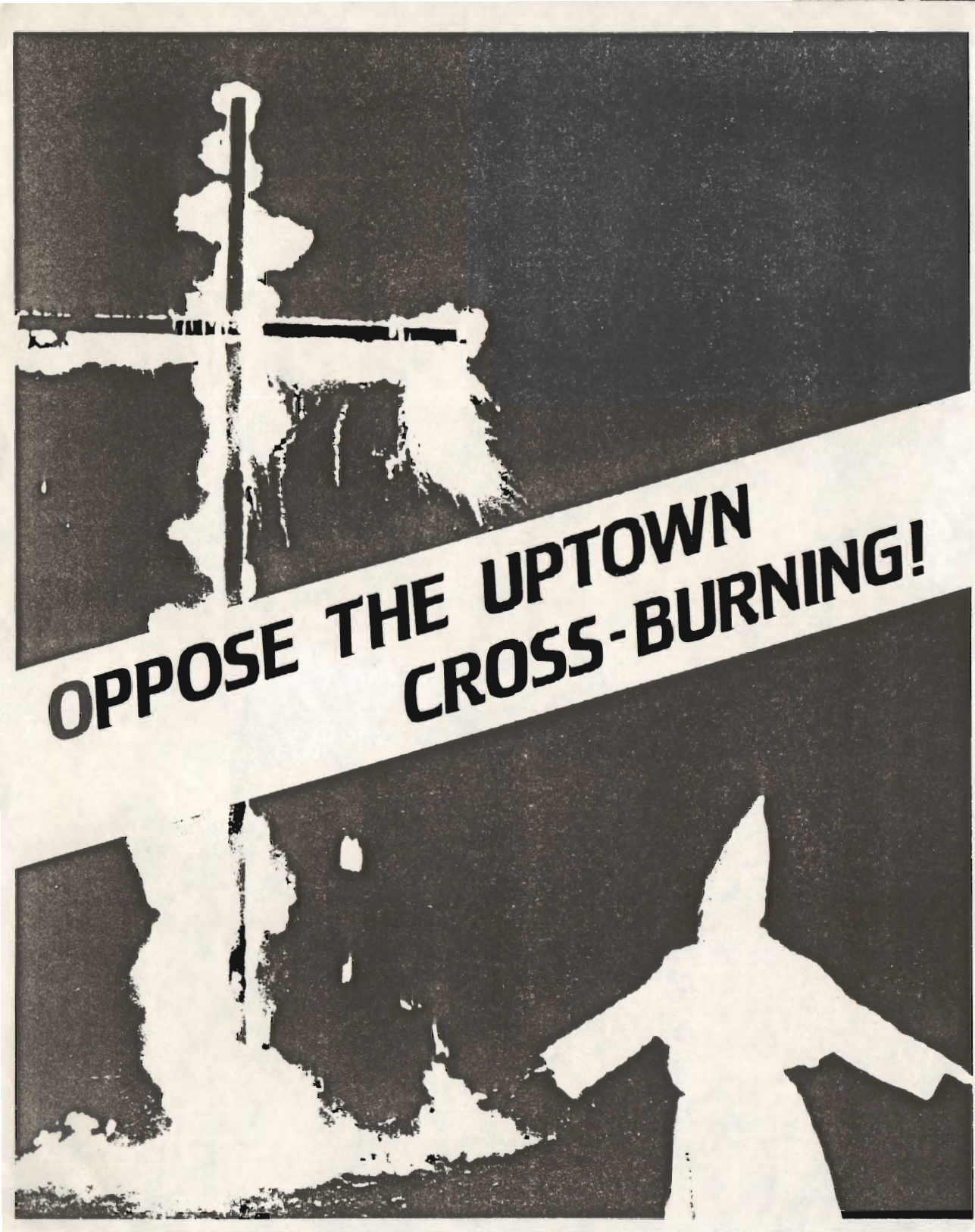




**OPPOSE THE UPTOWN

UPTOWN, September 3, 1984: For residents of this northside community, the Labor Day weekend ended with an act of racial bigotry and violence. At approximately 9:00 PM, Monday, a 20-foot cross was burned as 15-20 people — some dressed in white robes — carried Confederate flags.

The fiery cross and the Confederate flag are symbols of white supremacy that have been used for over a hundred years to terrorize Black people. The Uptown cross-burning occurred in the 4600 block of Malden, near Wilson. It is an integrated area — many Black, Latin and white families live in houses ringing the vacant lot whose charred grass and racist graffiti on nearby buildings are a daily reminder that racist violence is not confined to the pages of history books.

We must act NOW to prevent further racist violence and show that the people of Chicago will not tolerate any expression of racial hatred in our communities. We are community, religious, and other progressive organizations and individuals building this united response to the Uptown cross-burning and all forms of racist violence. JOIN US!
