WHITES COORDINATE ACTIONS AGAINST RACISM

On Friday, May 10, representatives from over 30 white organizations, called together by the Newton-Seale Campaign Committee of the Peace and Freedom Party, met to coordinate activities in support of the Black Panther Party and aimed at eradicating racism in the white community, and especially within the police force.

The organizations present included political, community, welfare, student, legal, medical, business, professional, religious, anti-poverty, trade union and literary groups. They formed a loose coalition called the COORDINATING COMMITTEE AGAINST RACISM.

The COORDINATING COMMITTEE AGAINST RACISM (CCAR), as its first unified action, is calling attention to NATIONAL POLICE WEEK, May 13-18 (Mon-Fri). The Oakland Police Department is celebrating the week with nightly tours beginning at 7:15 p.m. at the Police Administration Building, 6th and Washington Streets in Oakland. The CCAR is encouraging all citizens concerned with the problem of racism in our community to attend these lectures and tours and to ask questions.

Fact sheets will be available outside the doors of the building each night.

On Wednesday night the CCAR is calling for a picket line, beginning at 6:30 pm outside the Police Administration Building at 6th & Washington, Oakland. The purpose of the picket line will be to inform the public of the racist nature of the Oakland Police Department; to protest police harassment and brutalization of the Panthers; to demand the indictment and trial of the police murderers of Bobby Hutton; to demand the release of Eldridge Cleaver and Freedom for Huey Newton. The public and the press are invited to attend and participate.
