



Fund Housing and Jobs, Not Jails and Repression!

Free the Resistance Conspiracy Case Six!

Today, approximately 700,000 poor and oppressed people are imprisoned in the U.S. The Bush administration plans to spend \$1 billion in 1990 to build more prisons. The government with its new "anti-crime" campaign is waging a war on Black, Latino, Native American and poor white youth to divert attention from the real problems:

- Joblessness and homelessness
- Racist attacks
- Lack of healthcare and education
- Attacks on a woman's right to choose
- AIDS and violence against lesbians and gay men
- U.S. military intervention in Central America, the Middle East, Asia and Africa

The Bush administration continues to persecute political activists who fight against these injustices. Currently, six activists — Laura Whitehorn, Susan Rosenberg, Linda Evans, Marilyn Buck, Tim Blunk and Alan Berkman — are charged in the "Resistance Conspiracy Case" with conspiracy to commit four bombings in the Washington, D.C. area, including the bombing of the U.S. Capitol following the invasion of Grenada and the bombing of the War College. No one was injured in any of these actions and the government admits it does not know who did them.

The Resistance Conspiracy Case is the last of the indictments brought by the Reagan/Meese Justice Department — the same Justice Department that conducted an illegal investigation of CISPES and the Central American solidarity movement. During the Reagan era, Puerto Rican Independentistas, Black/New Afrikan revolutionaries and white radicals were targetted for fighting for human rights and national liberation.

The Resistance Conspiracy six have been dragged through 14 separate trials and are already serving sentences totalling 235 years for their opposition to U.S. war crimes. If convicted in the present case, they face an additional 270 years. The Resistance Conspiracy Case defendants, as do all political prisoners and prisoners of war in the U.S., face isolation and psychological torture in special high security units like Marion prison in Illinois and Marianna prison in Florida. The real criminals, the Ollie Norths and John Poindexters, will never see a day in jail.

This spring in Washington, D.C., the government is planning a show trial in repression complete with snipers, armed guards, a courtroom with a ten foot high bulletproof wall and surveillance cameras trained on the Resistance Conspiracy Case defendants and supporters. We must not allow our movement to be criminalized or intimidated. Attend the trial and support the Resistance Conspiracy Six.

Our sisters and brothers in the Resistance Conspiracy Case must be set free! They have been part of the progressive movement for over 20 years. We need them back in our communities and our movements as we continue to struggle for justice.

- Free all political prisoners and prisoners of war
- Build houses not jails
